Some chemicals generate metabolic byproducts that could be used for diagnosis but detection of these byproducts may not be possible until many hours after initial exposure. Making a diagnosis of chemical poisoning begins with taking a thorough medical history, including symptoms, and completing a physical examination. Diagnostic tests can vary depending on the type of chemical poisoning that is suspected. Tests can help to pinpoint a specific toxin or

Symptoms depend on which gas or chemical is inhaled and how deeply and for how long it was inhaled. Symptoms may include irritation of the eyes or nose, cough, blood in the sputum, and shortness of breath.
