To provide good sight lines to projection screens, ceilings in classrooms with flat floors should be at least 13 feet high in front of the screens. Ceilings in tiered floor classrooms also need to be at least 13 feet high in front of screens to insure that light from the projector will not be in the instructor's eyes.
